I prefer to run it through and ADA MP-1 preamp on a clean setting (low:0, mid:-4, presence:0, treble:-2), a Mesa/Boogie 50/50 power amp on the low power setting, and a Rectifier 2x12 cabinet. (A 4x12 might sound even better, but I doubt I could lift it.) I've considered using a Mesa/Boogie preamp, but I can't find any fault in the SansAmp, so why bother! The sound is kind of Petrucci'ish if anything. The secret is to not give in to the temptation to use tons of gain. Any fairly technical guitar player will not use as much gain as you think they are, because it muddles intricate parts.
